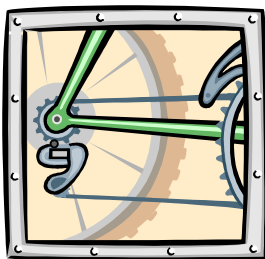

President*

Kudos to the following club members who participated in the challenging Fall n' Leaf tour on October 14th: Tom Cline, Bud Ennis, Karen Farago, Steve Woosley, Dan Murphy, Dan & Tina Maddock, and yours truly. The event is sponsored by the Mid Ohio Bikers and is held just southeast of Mansfield. The ride climbs up and rolls down the hills surrounding the scenic B&O bicycle trail. Those who rode the 60 mile route completed over 4,500 feet of vertical climbing. It was all the climbing I ever cared to do in one day. Getting back on the bike trail for the final 5 miles back to the finish was a great relief, knowing that there weren't

anymore hills to climb.

Kudos also, to the Mobility Education Foundation of Seattle, WA. They are conducting a pilot course in Federal Way, WA, which incorporates the League of American Bicyclists Road I education course along with a drivers training course. The hope is that the cross mobility training will graduate better drivers behind the handlebars as well as behind the steering wheel.

A bag of cow chips to U.S. Secretary of Transportation Mary Peters who in August on a nationally syndicated TV political talk show put down bicycle project

funding. She chided Congress for wasting the money they get for transportation, citing "bicycle paths" as a prime example of the waste because they are not transportation related. The reality is that only about 1% of all federal transportation funds are spent on bicycle or walking projects. We all know that both are forms of transportation. Secretary Peters also left the impression that the bridge collapse in Minnesota could be linked to under funding in bridge repair because of programs like "bicycle paths." The reality is that hundreds of millions of dollars in unspent

#3 - Zipper: long or short?

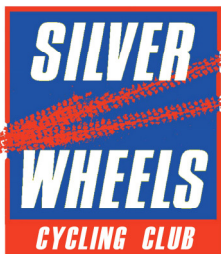
#4 - Bottom/Waist: elastic, no elastic?

#5 - Material: light-weight, heavier-weight, breathable, wickable, or warm and cuddly?

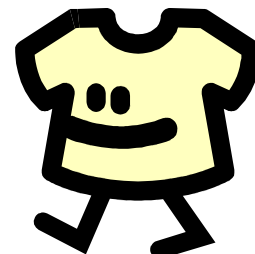

The deadline for article submission is the 15th of every month.

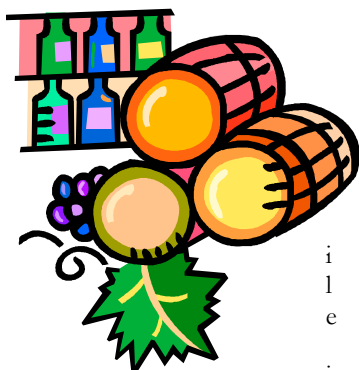
